WAYS TO TEACH YOUR CHILD EMPATHY REMIND HER THAT EVERYONE HAS A STORY. WHEN YOUR KIDS COMPLAIN ABOUT A FRIEND'S RUDE OR HURTFUL BEHRVIOR, HELP STEER THEM TOWARD LOOKING PAST THE SUBFRACE INTO WHY THE PERSON MAY HAVE ACTED THAT WAY. IT CAN BE EARY TO TAKE SOMEONE'S BEHRVIOR TOWARD YOU AT FACE VALUE, BUT SO MANY TIMES, OTHER UNSEEN FACTORS ARE INFLUENTIAL. MEET YOUR CHILD'S EMOTIONAL NEEDS. IF YOUR CHILDREN ARE SECURE IN GETTING THEIR EMOTIONAL NEEDS MET, THEY WILL BE MORE ABLE TO DEVELOP EMPATHY FOR OTHERS. TALK WITH YOUR KIDS ABOUT THEIR RENOTIONS, THEIR PERSPECTIVES, AND THEIR NEEDS. BE ROOMAND WITH THOSE AROUND HIM. WHEN YOUR CHILDREN SEE THINGS IN COMMON WITH OTHERS, THEY ARE MORE ABLE TO UNDERSTRIND AND SYMPATHIZE WITH THEM AND THEIR SITUATIONS. THIS PROCESS MAKE A CHILD SEE OTHERS AS HUMAN BEINGS RATHER THAN ONE-DIMENSIONAL OBJECTS. CALL YOUR CHILD ON HER BAD BEHAVIOR. IF YOUR CHILDREN DO SOMETHING RUDE OR MEAN TO YOU, CALL THEM ON IT. SETTING LIMITS IN THIS WAY HELPS YOUR CHILDREN UNDERSTAND THE EFFECTS OF THEIR BEHAVIOR ON OTHERS. REMIND HIM THAT THERE ARE MANY DIFFERENT POINTS OF VIEW. TALK ABOUT HOW EVERYORE'S OPINION DESERVES RESPECT. THEY WILL LEARN TO THINK OUTSIDE THEIR OWN VIEWS AND COMPORT ZONE, WHICH WILL HARKE THEM MORE ABLE TO EMPATHIZE WITH OTHER PEOPLE.
