


Class teachers will be announced before the end of term.

SEMESTER 2 REPORTS

The end of year is fast approaching and we are busy finalising Semester 2 reports. We will be busy and working hard until Friday 16th December. Semester 2 reports will be sent home on Wednesday 14th December. Please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns about your child's learning.

COVID-19 UPDATE

NSW Health recently advised that we are starting to see a rise in COVID-19 transmissions within the community, with a peak expected in early December. COVID-smart measures continue to be in place and are vital in allowing us to keep our schools operational while prioritising student and staff well-being. These measure include:

- Staying home if unwell and/or showing symptoms
- Mask-wearing strongly encouraged, particularly when indoors and/or when physical distancing is not possible.
- Continued mandatory mask-wearing for anyone working with students at greater risk of serious illness whether they be in a specialist centre, support unit or mainstream classroom.
- Using Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) when showing symptoms or exposed to COVID-19.
- Encouraging all students, staff and families to keep up to date with their vaccinations including booster shots if eligible.
- NSW Health also encourages everyone in the community to continue to register positive RATs with Service NSW to ensure they receive timely support and advice, including access to antivirals for those eligible.

Today each child will receive a supply of RATs to be used when needed.






